Grand Avenue was the other "Mother Road," U.S. Route 60, and what a mother she's been. The main route into downtown Phoenix from points west, it's become a vibrant street lined with mid-century motels converted to artist space; mechanics' shops that house chopper and hot-rod fabricators; a former bakery now home to galleries and a cafe; a guitar-making school in an old tire warehouse; and more.

Grand Avenue Arts & Preservation welcomes you to our annual Festival! Stroll or roll into artists' spaces and restaurants, historic commercial buildings, and out-of-the-way shops.

New this year will be a powerhouse **Art Car** component. Don't miss the exhibitions and lavishly decorated cars from around Arizona and from the **Art Car World Museum** in Douglas, Arizona, led by Director Harrod Blank. The car theme continues with the return of oversized military vehicles turned art showcases from **Walter Studios**. That all happens at **Unexpected Gallery**, 734 W. Polk Street.

Stephen and Sahar Strange will host the **11th Phoenix Annual Parade of the Arts**. The Parade theme is "Super Heroes." Participants may create their own non-motorized floats and costumes with the Festival theme—but no costume is needed to join the arts procession, which starts at Unexpected Gallery at dusk.

Indulge your love of fashion, architecture, food, music, art, adaptive reuse, recycling, and history. Uncover the secrets of this historic gem on the edge of downtown Phoenix. And hang around for the After Hours festivities, which start at 8pm. Enjoy a day of exploration in our diverse and walkable neighborhood.

ART CARS IN ARIZONA

Grand Avenue has always had a car-based history, so adding art cars to the Festival is a perfect fit. Organized by Art Car World and curated by Harrod Blank, "**Arizona Art Car Exhibit**" will be at Unexpected Gallery, 734 W. Polk St. There you'll see eight elaborately decorated art cars, including Oh My God and the Camera Van by Harrod Blank of Douglas, AZ; The Ploppet by Claire and Kyle Johnson of Scottsdale; The Madonna Car by Jose Benavides of Chandler; the Owl Car by Kate Pearson of Bisbee; J Gurl by Diane Bombshelter of Tucson; the MondrianMobile by Emily Duffy, Douglas; and The Nevada Car by David Best and Patrick Dailey of Bisbee. In addition, there will be:

- An exhibit of 20 Art Car photographs.
- Art Car film Automorphosis by Harrod Blank showing at 2pm and 4:30pm During those screenings, Blank, Director of Art Car World in Douglas, also gives an overview of his process and signs his book Art Cars.
- Art Car artist work on display, including sculpture, hand-painted ceramic plates, paintings on black velvet, and mixed media works.
- Meet the Art Car artists from Noon to 3pm.

Curious how this all started? Well, in 1977 Harrod Blank was a Santa Cruz High School freshman and he really wanted a Mustang, but all he could afford was a \$600 white 1965 VW bug. Frustrated, he painted a rooster on the passenger door (he was raising exotic poultry at the time). Astounded by his sudden popularity as the "Chicken Man," he kept decorating his car. Over the years, the car became more personal and represented a totem of his identity. He learned about photography and film making from his documentarian father Les Blank, and as he learned of other people who created "Art Cars," he began photographing and filming them. Today, he is building a museum for Art Cars—Art Car World—on the border of Mexico in Douglas, Ariz.

Circus Farm Fire Twirlers** will perform when the procession returns for After Hours. 
LOOK UP-IT'S ART



"UNDER THE VINTAGE ROOF"

Get ready for the fabulous, FREE annual "Under the Vintage Roof" tours, organized this year by Jim McPherson, President of Arizona Preservation Foundation, and Jill Johnson, Director of Phoenix Rising Tours. You will learn the fascinating history of Grand Avenue, and tour with knowledgeable guides including Louisa Stark, Tim Eigo, Jim McPherson, and Jill Johnson, while visiting 4 properties.

You will visit the original 1927 Rebhein Market/Fischer Owl Drugs (now The Lodge and {9} the Gallery); the 1946 cast-in-place concrete Bragg's Pie Factory building (now a mix of

uses); the 1955 Hotel Desert Sun (just completing a 3 year renovation; don't miss this sneak peek!); and the 1961 Caravan Inn West Motel/Bali-Hi

Motor Hotel (now Grand Arthaus and Oasis on Grand). You will hear some fascinating stories on how adaptive reuse and historic preservation projects have succeeded in the Historic Grand Avenue area, and can ask questions of the various property owners and your guides.
